

*I/V Sidney Spencer by Det. Sgt. Boelts #C10

I interviewed Sidney SPENCER by telephone while she was in the [REDACTED] office of her attorney. Ms. SPENCER was accompanied by her daughter as well. The entire interview was recorded on digital audio and the recording will be placed in evidence. What follows is a synopsis of my interview with her.

I first asked Ms. SPENCER about her medical status. She and her daughter told me that her memory is still suffering so her daughter did interject with some of her ailments. SPENCER is said to have suffered or still be suffering problems with her Kidneys, Liver and feeling in her right arm and her left leg. She is suffering from blurry vision, headaches, shortness of breath, fatigue and worry. She said she is also experiencing issues with her blood pressure.

Spencer said she did not get normal sleep during her time at the Spiritual Warrior retreat. Some nights she went to sleep late due to projects or assignments. She did say that she was told on more than one occasion to include 1 tsp of sea salt in her water every time she filled her water bottle. SPENCER said that she was informed prior to entering the sweat lodge that it would be very hot in there and RAY said that some people might pass out. She said that she started the sweat in a sitting position because it was too crowded to lay down. She was positioned between James SHORE and Kirby BROWN. She does remember hearing RAY say "come on try to stick it out"

SPENCER said she was unconscious at some time during the sweat lodge and had to be removed from the lodge. She was unaware of who pulled her out but was told that Marta and Melinda had pulled her out of the sweat lodge. She was not certain if they had come in to the lodge to remove her or if one of her fellow participants had pulled her near the door and they pulled her the rest of the way out.

SPENCER also said that Rosie, Dawn, Sylvia and Sylvia's fiance, plus one "other guy" told her that JAMES (RAY) would not allow people to come out.
