

*I/V Peters, Alexis (Colleen Conway info Suicide 07/2009) C27

On October 12, 2009 at approximately 12:16 p.m. (PST) I conducted a telephonic interview with Alexis Peters. The following is a transcription of the interview. Please refer to the audio recording placed into evidence for complete details.

Interviewer: Okay. I am back and I think I am better. I got a pen at least.

Respondent: Okay, all right good

Interviewer: And also, your name was again Alexis Peters?

Respondent: Yes, that's right.

Interviewer: Oh I got it right.

Respondent: Good memory. And this actually isn't related to the deaths happened or even anybody there and I just had information I thought I should share with you guys.

Interviewer: That's fine.

Respondent: We are the owner of [REDACTED]. It employs about 100 employees. And on July, we had an employee who went to one of these James Arthur Ray's seminars and it was in San Diego. And while she was there, I mean, we knew her very well, she committed suicide.

Interviewer: Oh really.

Respondent: Yeah they had a group thing and then they went to a mall and what they did is they took the identity from them and she actually jumped off of third-storey balcony of what is called Horton Plaza Mall in San Diego.

Interviewer: That's the open mall?

Respondent: Yeah, I don't know, I have never been there or heard.

Interviewer: Oh yeah.

Respondent: And it's just, really weird.

Interviewer: Do you have her name?

Respondent: Yeah it's Colleen Conway. And she committed suicide on July 26th.

Interviewer: July 26th, what year?

Respondent: This year, over the summer.

Interviewer: Oh this is recently.

Respondent: Yes, and --

Interviewer: In San Diego?

Respondent: Yeah. And just to know a little bit of psychology, I mean obviously you guys know more than I do, but she was like making plans for be in home you know like she wasn't, she had no times of anything like this. And I did a little bit of research and there is this large group awareness training, are you familiar with that?

Interviewer: No.

Respondent: It's kind of like, I feel like I am telling you too much information, but --

Interviewer: No you are not, it's just helping.

Respondent: Okay, it is like where, if you Google it or something, I was a psychology major and I know what they do is they deprive you of food and they bring the temperature to extremes like you know you are going to go really hot and then you are going to go to cool weather and it kind of messes, it's a brain-washing technique. It's we learned about in school. And they deprive you of food, they say they are going to hold these really long seminars. And what happened after she died is, I got an agenda of the schedule when she was there, I don't know if you have gotten any of it, they probably had it for that one too, but they have the disclaimers for all of it, you know like we will not getting food, you know it's all the fine print.

Interviewer: Right.

Respondent: But they are definitely using those brain-washing tactics and I know, I mean I can, this Colleen would not have committed suicide, like something was going on, like something severely not right happened there. And it has been bothering me ever since when I heard about this on the news this morning, I had to call and tell somebody.

Interviewer: No, I appreciate. We are trying to find other, we need to build a case and to do that we need to know of people that have been injured in the past and things like that. Did she talk about Mr. Ray in particular?

Respondent: Yeah, she did, not specifically with me, but some people whom she works with have talked about him specifically, but she didn't talk about him. And we actually have a detective here in my hometown which is in [REDACTED] not in San Diego that has been working on her case, he has the information, yeah I am pretty sure he is a detective.

Interviewer: So she was in city and she never came home, in the [REDACTED]

Respondent: Right.

Interviewer: Okay.

Respondent: And the weird thing this is a lady you know 46 years old, I think she was, completely normal and the weekend before she went to one of these seminars in Chicago.

Interviewer: Same company?

Respondent: The same thing, and then the next weekend she had to go back and she went to one in California, I mean something was really weird.

Interviewer: So he does have a process, I think just for once you attend this one and then you need to go to this, I think the end of it, it is a Spiritual Warrior thing.

Respondent: Right. And I have a feeling that well she had also put a time off request for October and I am wondering if that's the one she was going to, you know, the one that you are working in Arizona. Just really weird thing is like the disclaimer on the thing that they were talking about that they don't feed them you know and you are there and there is meetings all day, you know she wasn't eating, I mean I know this is different case but --

Interviewer: It's same thing so-so.

Respondent: It's a definite brain washing and it has got large people awareness, you simply get up, large people awareness training.

Interviewer: Right.

Respondent: And like there have been like long suits were used in that training, but like another, now not with James Arthur Ray of course learning that in school, but people have died you know.

Interviewer: Right, okay and that's --

Respondent: I don't know if we have something that is kind of related to that, there's got to be other people out there.

Interviewer: Right. And there probably is and that's why we are going to following up on these. So it's very important, I get this. What county you guys in, in [REDACTED] that a detective would be working, so I can maybe get a hold of the police station or sheriff's office in that area?

Respondent: It's [REDACTED]. And I believe his name, his last name is Pedro.

Interviewer: Pedro?

Respondent: Yeah it's a small county we live in. Jerry Pedro is his name. And he could probably give you more information.

Interviewer: Is it [REDACTED]?

Respondent: [REDACTED]

Interviewer: [REDACTED] I know you guys have access, by the way.

Respondent: Okay, thanks. Yeah and she was in San Diego when that took place.

Interviewer: Okay, cool and I appreciate that. Did she have family members that were concerned, so I could talk to them and maybe they have some information too?

Respondent: Everybody has been concerned. Everybody knows that this was not her. I mean all of her family, all of her coworkers; everybody knows that this was just weird. I mean this is just, we almost didn't believe it you know, because I mean no signs like you know obviously people give signs you know, absolutely nothing. So I know her family is very concerned.

Interviewer: Do you have any information of her family, is her name Colleen Conaway, is that a married name?

Respondent: No, she wasn't married.

Interviewer: Was that her maiden name?

Respondent: Yeah.

Interviewer: So her mom and dad will be Conaway.

Respondent: Right. You could probably get her parents name, if you want them.

Interviewer: I really would. I can give call back to you later and if you want me to and if you can find out, I would like to see if there is, maybe they actually talked to her and that way I can get first hand information, that would be

Respondent: Right.

Interviewer: Your information is good, I don't mean anything by that.

Respondent: No, no, no. I definitely agree and I know that they would be willing to, I mean I don't know, but I assume they'd be willing to help however they could. Yeah I can gather the names of her family for you.

Interviewer: If you don't mind and I will give you a call back. Are you calling from work at [REDACTED]?

Respondent: Yeah we own the company, so.

Interviewer: What was her job there, what did she do?

Respondent: She was a dental technician. She made soldered appliances. Basically, she made dental appliances. And she was working here for like over 20 years, I mean we knew her very well, extremely well.

Interviewer: Okay. So did you see her when she came back from Chicago?

Respondent: I didn't actually because I was on maternity leave, but I know a bunch of other people that did, I mean we have kind of hassled that you know how that goes. So I maybe not the person to talk to, but I just had a call.

Interviewer: Oh I definitely appreciate Alexis. That's cool. If I don't get people doing this we will never be able to figure out what's going on.

Respondent: And there is definitely something going on, like If you can get any of the agendas for any of those weekend things, I know I have one because I printed it out because I was like, they are going to take this off the internet.

Interviewer: Yeah I got one, but I didn't get the ones for Chicago.

Respondent: Okay. I got the one, I didn't get the one for Chicago, I have the one for that's the one she was at in San Diego.

Interviewer: Okay, that's cool. Could you e-mail it to me?

Respondent: Yeah I can probably scan it, yeah I can figure it out somehow how to do that.

Interviewer: Can I give you my information?

Respondent: Sure.

Interviewer: Ready, first name is [REDACTED] and if you want I can send you an e-mail and give you, and you will have all my information on it if you want to.

Respondent: Yeah that would be cool if you could do that.

Interviewer: I can do that.

Respondent: It's my personal one, its [REDACTED]

Interviewer: Got you. I will send you my information that way you have it and you have all the contacts.

Respondent: Okay and I will give you my phone too for when you call back, it's the work one is [REDACTED]

Interviewer: Is it the [REDACTED]

Respondent: No that's just an outside line kind of you know.

Interviewer: Okay.

Respondent: [REDACTED] and that's the [REDACTED] number.

Interviewer: Cool.

Respondent: Yeah I will definitely e-mail that over to you.

Interviewer: I appreciate that Alexis.

Respondent: And then I will gather the name of someone in her family and their phone numbers.

Interviewer: Okay cool.

Respondent: Yeah. You should definitely get in touch with that Pedro guy from [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Police Department. I know that he has a lot of information because I know that the family they boxed up all her stuff and I don't know they had to do with him and they gave it to the police department.

Interviewer: Okay.

Respondent: And I know that they have them that information but something has to be done.

Interviewer: Absolutely.

Respondent: I mean I am not telling you that, but I am glad that I am talking to you because ever since this happened I knew that there is just something not quite right there. Anytime anybody will put anything on the internet I will know it, because it's like after

that happened I was like this is just weird, so I was trying to get in touch with like somebody who was at that thing with her you know what did they tell the people in the group like she just committed suicide. I don't know. It's just really weird.

Interviewer: It is.

Respondent: And I want you to read the disclaimers on that thing that I e-mail you.

Interviewer: Okay, I definitely will.

Respondent: Anyways that's all I have to say, but I will get that other information.

Interviewer: Okay. And I will e-mail you just the confirmation so that you know who you are talking to and all that stuff. You will get my information. I appreciate Alexis. Thank you very much.

Respondent: Thank you very much Mike, I will get in touch with you (Inaudible).

Interviewer: Bye now.

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
